We are pleased to take this opportunity to greet you and to provide you with information about our home-based services.

As you know, your family has been referred to our program for services based on the identified outcomes in your Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) provided by the Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD). All of our services are provided in your family's natural environment (i.e. your home and/or community). A to Z Therapies is an Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP) registered provider.

Your child has been referred for the following service(s):

____ Special Instruction: A Developmental Specialist (DSI) is a professional who works with you to assess and provide information on development, community resources, activities, strategies, and curriculum. All outcomes identified in your IFSP are addressed, with an emphasis placed on your family's identified priorities, resources, and concerns. The DSI will assist in designing learning environments and activities that promote the child's acquisition of skills in a variety of developmental areas, including cognitive processes and social interaction. Curriculum planning including the planned interaction of personnel, materials, and time and space that leads to achieving the Outcomes in the child's IFSP. Providing families with information, skills, and support related to enhancing the skill development of the child. We work with the child to enhance the child's development.

____ Occupational Therapy: An Occupational Therapist (OT) assists people of all ages to become independent in their daily activities. The therapist considers the individual's developmental level, unique skills and abilities when looking at the occupations of daily life (including self care, productivity and leisure) as well as the environment in which the individual performs these occupations, including its physical, social and cultural resources and barriers. Areas of treatment may include fine motor skills, strength, sensory integration, and visual motor perception, as well as splinting - - just to name a few.

____ Physical Therapy: A Physical Therapist (PT) treats individuals of all ages with musculoskeletal disorders, neurological disorders, and motor and ambulation concerns. Physical Therapists use therapeutic exercise to restore strength, movement, balance, coordination and endurance. They also can assist in determining the need for special equipment such as wheelchairs.

____ Speech-Language Pathology: A Speech-Language Pathologist (ST) is a professional committed to the research, prevention, evaluation, treatment and counseling of communication disorders. These disorders may include congenital, developmental, and acquired disorders of speech, voice, resonance, fluency, phonology, swallowing, language, and cognitive-communication.
